The Inner Adolescent

Implications for adult psychopathology and healing

A significant majority of adult mental health issues have their origins in adolescence, research indicating that at least 75% of psychiatric disorders emerge during this developmental stage. The focus of this workshop is to illuminate the transformative possibility of deep and compassionate connection with the inner adolescent - a powerful healing process which is commonly overlooked when working with adult clients.

Adolescence is a time of intensity, when existential selfhood and meaning making get underway in earnest. Self-discovery is infused with the imprint of our prior experience and an already well-shaped worldview. Lots of young people flourish - their unfolding into adulthood is a relatively supported and fluent transition. Plenty struggle too, their journey through the adolescent years having been subtly or not-so-subtly shaped by shame and lack of support.

As we grow and evolve, the influence of the adolescent years continues to reverberate throughout our lives, such is the significance of this critical developmental episode in the experience of being human. Many of the adults in our world demonstrate entrenched adolescent configuration styles: they may look like adults; but developmentally may still be a long way off. Their path through adulthood is defined by self-defeating patterns, addiction, interpersonal struggles and other creative adjustments resulting from the unfinished business of adolescence. This has implications for psychotherapeutic contact with our adult clients.
